

Nursing Assistant I

NAA100

NAA100 is taught each fall, spring, and summer semester at the Hopkinsville campus and the Ft. Campbell campus.

This course will provide knowledge and skills for nurse aides to assume the role and responsibility required in a long term setting. The focus is communication, infection control, safety, resident/patient rights, and basic nursing skills.

Active status on a state nurse aide registry is a pre-requisite for admission to the RN and PN programs. NAA 100 and the state nurse aide exam will fulfill this requirement.

This course has a strict attendance policy with no room to miss class, lab, or clinical.

You must be able to lift and/or move up to 50 pounds.

Requirements:

- *Negative TB skin test
- *Hep B series or titer
- *CPR certification
- *Liability ins (\$11 fee assessed at time of registration)
