

# NAA100 On-Ground Class Format Nursing Assistant Skills I



Financial Aid may be available

This course will provide the knowledge and skills for the nurse aide to assume the role and responsibilities required in a long term care setting. The focus is on communication, infection control, safety, resident/patient rights, and basic nursing skills.

Classes are offered during the spring and fall semesters as either a 16-week class at the Hopkinsville campus or an 8-week class at the Fort Campbell campus. A class may be offered during the summer term in Hopkinsville. Please check the schedule for class offerings.

This on-ground class has a strict attendance policy with no room to miss class, lab, or clinical days. Required class, lab, and clinical hours are mandated by the Kentucky Department of Medicaid Services.

## Class Requirements:

- Proof of negative TB test
- Hepatitis B series, titer, or declination statement
- BLS for Healthcare Providers CPR certification through American Heart Association
- Liability insurance (\$11 fee assessed at time of registration per semester)
- Background check \$43
  - Certain items on the background check may affect your ability to attend clinical. Please contact the Nursing department for further information.
- Statement of Understanding
- Must be able to lift and/or move up to 50 pounds

The **Kentucky Nurse Aide Registry exam** is offered on the Hopkinsville Campus. After successful completion of NAA 100, you have **one year** from the course completion date to take the state nurse aide registry exam. Passing the state nurse aide registry exam will allow the examinee to work as a CNA. Having an active status on the state nurse aide registry will meet the State Nurse Aide Registry requirement for the HCC RN and PN programs.



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
